### **Engineering**

- Chelsey inquired on easement for sink hole in Salt Creek Commons. T. Dixon to reach out to the County on easement signatories.
- S. Retherford reports that Loundenber sinkhole has been filled with gravel. Neither the County nor TCCD was granted an easement. Unsure of who filled sinkhole.
- Engineer Stewart requests that TCCD or County be deeded easements around boundaries. Current status is unknown who the easements were granted.
- MS 4 report/plan passed out. Discussion ensued.
- Outfalls need maintenance. D. Efantis to reach out to John McQuestion for repair of outfalls. Possible December meeting attendance to speak about specifics of outfall upgrades.
- MOU needs to be completed with the County for MS 4 compliance. Attorney Barkes will reach out to County Stormwater so that collaboration can be completed.

Professor Juan Carlos discussed how Valparaiso University and TCCD could collaborate with their engineering students on flooding/environmental issues. Engineer Stewart will provide the professor with the requested documentation. Engineer Stewart suggested using the students to test the outfall stormwater.
